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Overview

James Hume is a barrister with a focus on commercial litigation and arbitration as well as construction and property law. He began his 12-month pupillage at 3PB's London office in October 2024, having previously worked as an Aviation officer in The Fleet Air Arm of the Royal Navy.

As part of the Fleet Air Arm, James gained five years of front-line experience concisely conveying information to NATO command structures of varying language ability. Additionally, he has over a decade of experience in working in naval squadrons and ships, demonstrating advanced teamwork and interpersonal skills in pressured environments. As a Maritime Warfare Centre doctrine lead and subject matter expert, James was regularly required to communicate and advise Senior Officers on key deliverable commercial contracts.

James received a degree from the University of York in Physics with Astrophysics, after which he received a merit in a foundation degree in Military Aviation Studies studying base principles, aircraft technical components and their uses. Construction and engineering

James Hume's construction practice focuses on Defective Premises Act 1972 claims, Building Safety Act claims, Building Act 1984 claims, NHBC Guarantees as well as covering the full range of engineering and technical disputes.

James has multiple degrees and qualifications requiring highly technical knowledge and in his previous career in the armed forces was one of the UK's Unmanned Air Systems (UAS) and Counter UAS experts. As a specialist technician, James was required to regularly assist national level contract writing, including infrastructure contracts, to ensure that the critical technical elements of said contracts actually met the requirements.
